Having reported on some of the world's
most violent, least understood regions in
his bestsellers *Balkan Ghosts* and *The
Ends of the Earth*, Robert Kaplan now

returns to his native land, the United
States of America. Traveling, like
Tocqueville and John Gunther before him,
through a political and cultural landscape
in transition, Kaplan reveals a nation
shedding a familiar identity as it assumes
a radically new one. An Empire Wilderness
opens in Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, where
the first white settlers moved into Indian
country and where Manifest Destiny was
born. In a world whose future conflicts can
barely be imagined, it is also the place
where the army trains its men to fight the
next war. "A nostalgic view of the United
States is deliberately cultivated here,"
Kaplan writes, "as if to bind the uncertain
future to a reliable past." From Fort
Leavenworth, Kaplan travels west to the
great cities of the heartland--to St. Louis,

once a glorious shipping center expected
to outshine imperial Rome and now
touted, with its desolate inner city and
miles of suburban gated communities, as
"the most average American city." Kaplan
continues west to Omaha; down through
California; north from Mexico, across
Arizona, New Mexico, and Texas; up to
Montana and Canada, and back through
Oregon. He visits Mexican border
settlements and dust-blown county
sheriffs' offices, Indian reservations and
nuclear bomb plants, cattle ranches in the
Oklahoma Panhandle, glacier-mantled
forests in the Pacific Northwest, swanky
postsuburban sprawls and grim bus
terminals, and comes, at last, to the great
battlefield at Vicksburg, Mississippi, where
an earlier generation of Americans gave

their lives for their vision of an American future. But what, if anything, he asks, will today's Americans fight and die for? At Vicksburg Kaplan contemplates the new America through which he has just traveled--an America of sharply polarized communities that draws its population from pools of talent far beyond its borders; an America where the distance between winners and losers grows exponentially as corporations assume government functions and the wealthy find themselves more closely linked to their business associates in India and China than to their poorer neighbors a few miles away; an America where old loyalties and allegiances are vanishing and new ones are only beginning to emerge. The new America he found is in the pages of this book. Kaplan gives a precise and chilling vision of how the most successful nation the world has ever known is entering the final, and highly uncertain, phase of its history.

Reinhold Wagnleitner argues that cultural propaganda played an enormous part in integrating Austrians and other Europeans into the American sphere during the Cold War. In *Coca-Colonization and the Cold War*, he shows that 'Americanization' was the result not only of market forces and consumerism but also of systematic planning on the part of the United States. Wagnleitner traces the intimate relationship between the political and

economic reconstruction of a democratic Austria and the parallel process of cultural assimilation. Initially, U.S. cultural programs had been developed to impress Europeans with the achievements of American high culture. However, popular culture was more readily accepted, at least among the young, who were the primary target group of the propaganda campaign. The prevalence of Coca-Cola and rock 'n' roll are just two examples addressed by Wagnleitner. Soon, the cultural hegemony of the United States became visible in nearly all quarters of Austrian life: the press, advertising, comics, literature, education, radio, music, theater, and fashion. Hollywood proved particularly effective in spreading American cultural ideals. For Europeans, says Wagnleitner, the result was a second

discovery of America. This book is a translation of the Austrian edition, published in 1991, which won the Ludwig Jedlicka Memorial Prize.

Enchanting Borneo

In the 1930s, Paul Ben Baginsky, a member of the German Department faculty of Brooklyn College, was working on a book then called "The Development of the Notion of America in Germany" when it was stopped by the lack of bibliographic data to work from. It became clear that no more progress could be made without more adequate bibliographical foundations, and that's exactly what Baginsky set out to do. Based on, but not limited to, the extensive holdings of the New York Public Library, this book aims at being a comprehensive bibliography of the German publications dealing with any aspect of America which

were published before 1800. This includes not only books, but articles, essays, and book reviews. Each entry is arranged chronologically according to the publication date. These listings are made highly accessible by the addition of extensive and detailed subject, author, and title indexes. A new introduction and a selective bibliography have been added by Dr. Don H. Tolzmann, one of the foremost German-American scholars today. Anyone seeking information on Germans in American history before 1800 should examine this work, not only for topics pertaining to German immigration and settlement, but any possible historical topic, including esoteric subjects, such as forestry, science and medicine. This book is an essential reference for colonial German-American history.
