A total institution is defined by Goffman as a place of residence and work where a large number of like-situated, individuals, cut off from the wider society for an appreciable period of time, together lead an enclosed, formally administered round of life. Prisons serve as a clear example, providing we appreciate that what is prison-like about prisons is found in institutions whose members have broken no laws. This volume deals with total institutions in general and, mental hospitals, in particular. The main focus is, on the world of the inmate, not the world of the staff. A chief concern is to develop a sociological version of the structure of the self. Each of the essays in this book

were intended to focus on the same issue--the inmate's situation in an institutional context. Each chapter approaches the central issue from a different vantage point, each introduction drawing upon a different source in sociology and having little direct relation to the other chapters. This method of presenting material may be irksome, but it allows the reader to pursue the main theme of each paper analytically and comparatively past the point that would be allowable in chapters of an integrated book. If sociological concepts are to be treated with affection, each must be traced back to where it best applies, followed from there wherever it seems to lead, and pressed to disclose the rest of its family. orizzonte storico. Il Capitalismo Moderno di Sombart non deve essere visto nella sua funzione glorificatrice o denigratrice del capitalismo contemporaneo (anche se l'autore ha utilizzato frequentemente i suoi scritti ai fini della polemica immediata) ma appunto come un documento di quella polemica che ha riempito i primi decenni del XX secolo e che possa aiutarci a capire alcuni tratti dominanti della società industriale.

How cinema and video have transformed our perception of time
The year 1895 saw two events, from which *Time Machine: Cinematic Temporalities* takes its bearings: the publication of H.G. Tea is a unique crop and, incidentally, a very interesting and attractive one. The tea bush, its cultivation and harvesting do not fit into any typical cropping pattern. Moreover, its processing and marketing are specific to tea. Thus the Tea Industry stands apart and constitutes a self contained entity. This contributed to a technically competent industry but tended to bypass the more academic and fundamental investigations which might bring future rewards. The sponsorship of research has now widened and the range and depth of tea research has increased accordingly. The editors and authors of this book have played their part in these recent developments which are well reported in the book.

Sin dalla sua costruzione nel 1958, la storia del sottomarino sovietico di classe Hotel K-19, il primo a essere equipaggiato con missili nucleari, è stata costellata di luci e ombre. Varato l'8 aprile 1959, il K-19 fu costruito in un periodo in cui l'Unione Sovietica era intenzionata a eguagliare la potenza nucleare degli Stati Uniti, sino ad allora in netto vantaggio. Tuttavia, nella volontà di schierare il sommergibile rapidamente, come dimostrazione di potenza, furono messi in secondo piano diversi requisiti di sicurezza, determinando così una serie di malfunzionamenti. Il 4 luglio 1961 avvenne il più tragico degli incidenti: dopo alcune esercitazioni nell'Atlantico, a 45 metri di profondità, l'equipaggio del K-19, agli ordini del capitano Nikolaj Zateev, si trovò a fronteggiare un incubo nucleare. Una grave perdita nel reattore aveva causato il guasto del sistema di raffreddamento, portando a un pericoloso aumento della temperatura all'interno del nucleo. Ad aggravare la situazione si accompagnò anche il malfunzionamento del sistema radio, che lasciò l'equipaggio isolato e senza la possibilità di contattare Mosca. Il sottomarino fu costretto a emergere e gli uomini a un grande atto di coraggio, sacrificandosi per riparare l'avaria prima che causasse un disastro nucleare. Nel 2006, l'ex presidente dell'Unione Sovietica Michail Gorbačëv ha proposto l'equipaggio del sottomarino al Nobel per la pace, per le azioni compiute il 4 luglio 1961. L'incidente, secretato per quasi trent'anni, torna alla luce grazie alle ricerche di Peter Huchthausen che, recuperando le memorie del capitano Zateev, ricostruisce gli eventi che hanno portato a scongiurare una Terza Guerra Mondiale, rendendo il giusto merito a

degli eroi che hanno dato la vita per l'umanità.

Submarines had a vital, if often unheralded, role in the superpower navies during the Cold War.
